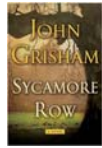

4. Sisterland, by Curtis Sittenfeld. Insights into sisterhood & motherhood in this story of twins with ESP.



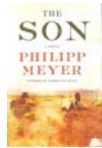
5. The Heist, by Janet Evanovich. An FBI agent and a con artist join forces to run elaborate scams on criminals.



6. Breaking Point, by C.J. Box. Joe Pickett tracks the father of his daughter's best friend.



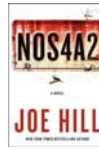
7. The Cuckoos Calling, by Robert Galbraith (JK Rowling). Private investigator Strike is plunged into the world of the rich & famous.



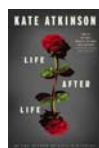
8. The Son, by Philipp Meyer. A family saga chronicling the settlement of the American West.



9. The Ocean at the End of the Lane, by Neil Gaiman. Dark creatures are on the loose—who survives?



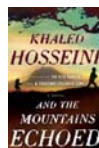

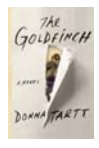
11. Life After Life, by Kate Atkinson. Every time Ursula Todd dies she is born again.

20. The Light in the Ruins, by Chris Bohjalian. Murder mystery and exploration of post-WW II.



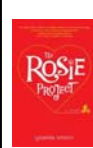
21. Unintended Consequences, by Stuart Woods. Stone Barrington wakes up in France with no memory of the past four days



22. Never Go Back, by Lee Child. Jack Reacher returns to his past and discovers a whopping mess.



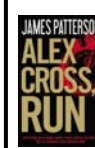
23. Me Before You, by Jojo Moyes. A moving story about a caretaker and her terminally ill boss.

27. Fly Away, by Kristin Hannah. An emotional tale of love, motherhood, loss & new beginnings.



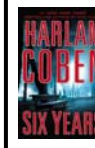
28. The Art Forger, by B.A. Shapiro. A thrilling novel about seeing (and not seeing) the secrets that lie beneath the canvas.
