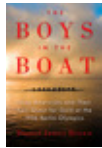

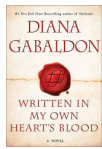
**1. Liar, Temptress, Soldier, Spy** by Karen Abbott. True stories of four women during the Civil War.

**4. Written in My Own Heart's Blood** by Diana Gabaldon. 8th novel in the Outlander series.



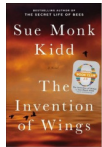
**5. Delicious!** by Ruth Reichl. A young woman with an amazing palate joins the staff of a food magazine.



**6. Leaving Time** by Jodi Picoult. A teen tries to find out why her mother disappeared ten years ago.



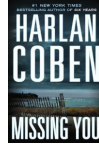
**7. The Daring Ladies of Lowell** by Kate Alcott. Young workers of the Lowell Mills fight for their rights.



**8. The Invention of Wings** by Sue Monk Kidd. Sweeping historical novel about abolitionist sisters.



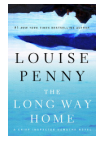
**9. Havana Storm** by Clive Cussler. Dirk Pitt and his children confront danger in the Caribbean.

**12. The Long Way Home** by Louise Penny. Chief Inspector Gamache follows a missing artist's travels.



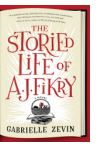
**13. Power Play** by Catherine Coulter. A US Ambassador is being framed and a psychopath is on the loose.

**25. Mr. Mercedes** by Stephen King. Three unlikely heroes try to stop a lone killer in a race against time.



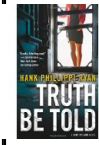
**26. Natchez Burning** by Greg Iles. Tale of racial hatred and redemption in modern South.

**28. Landline** by Rainbow Rowell. An old fashioned phone makes a difference for a couple with a troubled marriage.



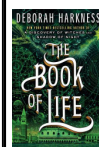
**29. Truth be Told** by Hank Phillippi Ryan. Clever mix of mystery and romance around Boston foreclosure fraud.
